The crucial role of nonprofits



The 'New Public Management' movement to improve government effectiveness drove more competitive contracting for services, public-private partnerships, and consumer choices.


U.S. 2010 nonprofit employment vs. selected other sectors

- "To date, major cuts in state and local funding have been at least partially offset by a huge influx of federal stimulus dollars; that one-time uplift is now being replaced by federal cuts. Unfortunately, the worst is yet to come, and it is not yet clear what can be done about it."

States face bleak economic forecast, report says

Property-tax reliant cities facing a sharper pinch


"Revenue and spending shifts in 2010 and 2011 portray a

2012."





Government Funding Varies By Sector




Can foundations make up the shortfall?

Adding it up

- Nonprofits always faced fiscal challenges.
- Nonprofits especially human services
 rely on government funding
- Budgets are tight currently
- More cuts likely going forward
- Conclusion: More than ever, financial management skills are not just nice – they are necessary.

Providers 'muddling through on thin margins'

- 2008 study by Fiscal Management
 Associates: fiscal management key
- But providers bravely "muddling through on thin margins and limited resources."
- And they lacked:
 - Strong fiscal management infrastructure
 - An environment conducive to effective operations



Weakness have internal and external causes

Internal causes

- Little appreciation of value of organizational infrastructure
- History of doing more with less

External causes

- Policies and Practices of Funders
- Variable, often inadequate funding of indirect costs
- Complicated Reporting Requirements

A Two-Pronged Approach Needed


